# -MIN. MARVA HARRISON-



Nelda's teaching philosophy is centered on the belief that every child has the potential to succeed when provided with the right support and encouragement. She empha-



It was a gray and black Toyota, well....a fading gray and a fading black, a hatchback, about 8 years old at the time, and a stick. Ha! A stick. That could be a holdup since I was still in the learning stage, but I could handle it. I tried to crank the old trap, but it just clicked. I tried again, combining my efforts with a plea. "Please God, I need my car!" Just as the motor turned over, I heard that dreadful sound, a swatch-type sound, like an old screen door dragging. My God! He knew I was going to try to get away. He knew, so he had unlocked the hatch back, ahead of time! He was in the back so





fast; all I could do was bite my lip and jerk forward. "Stop the car, Lynn, and give me the money!" he yelled, as he swiftly crawled into the back seat. He lurched through the bucket seats so fast that my head literally seemed to spin, like the girl in the Exorcist. Grabbing the steering wheel, he yelled again, "Gimme the money, Lynn!" You name it; I just about dealt with it. Many times over the years, I walked into my house to find that every piece of furniture and every appliance was gonesold in exchange for drugs. I remember waking up one Christmas Day to find that my babies'

gifts were gone, sold for drugs. Once, I frantically searched the streets of Tampa because my husband put our 6-year-old out of the car since it was "too dangerous to take him to the crack house," he said. This was before the days of cell phones. I don't even remember how I found my baby boy. I could go on and on, but the only thing that matters is that one day, I accepted the truth that I had to forgive if I expected to move on with my life. I have since come to grips with the truth, that my now ex-husband was a good person, who loved people. When he was straight, he would give away his last. When he was not, he would take another person's last. I literally saw him take his shirt off and give it away. Once he pulled off his watch and gave it away, and then took my watch and gave it away, too. He had a heart of gold, but in addiction, he was the devil. Still, I had to find a way to forgive. I owed it to myself. my children, and my God.







# THE BOOK OF CERTITUDE

## **BY MICHAEL JONES**

Everyone with a religious upbringing knows about The Golden Rule: "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you." Indeed, the Rule is integral to literally all the great world religions. For me, that's always been an indication that they are more alike than not, and one which led me to the Bahá'í Faith.

In the early 1860's, our Faith's founder, Bahá'u'lláh, wrote The Book of Certitude, which maintains that the great religions are in fact a series of progressive revelations from the same God; part of one continual process of spiritual guidance designed by Him to lead humanity toward peace and unity. Dictated over the course of two days, this remarkable work lays a unique

foundation for the establishment of unity between all religions, especially Judaism, Christianity and Islam, which all trace their heritage back to Abraham. But the founders of other great faiths, Buddha, Zoroaster, and Krishna, are also considered divine messengers.

In The Book of Certitude, Bahá'u'lláh created a new vision of these founders of the world's largest religions, whose followers often see them as competing prophets. Wars have been fought for centuries in attempts to prove the superiority of one Faith over another. But Bahá'u'lláh did not see God's messengers or their religions as competitors-he saw them as divine educators in the same school of religion. He explained that the same God

sent them to different peoples at different times to help them progress spiritually and materially.

In Bahá'í belief, each consecutive messenger prophesied the messenger to follow. As Jesus himself said, "And other sheep I have, which are not of this fold: them also I must bring, and they shall hear my voice; and there shall be one fold, and one shepherd." – John 10:16

This central Bahá'í teaching links all the founders of the world's great Faiths in one chain of being, one single system of belief. Bahá'u'lláh taught that the prophets of God bring the same ethical teachings in every age. Their specific prescriptions for living, the social laws of their Faiths, vary from age to age, however—because the

needs of each time are different. In The Book of Certitude, Bahá'u'lláh wrote that God sends all of these successive prophets "...down from the heaven of the Will of God, and as they all arise to proclaim His irresistible Faith, they therefore are regarded as one soul and the same person. For they all drink from the one Cup of the love of God, and all partake of the fruit of the same Tree of Oneness."



  - 10. Continued personal in-


ventory, and when wrong, promptly admitted it.

# "BE HOLY" IS A COMMAND, NOT A SUGGESTION. PART 4

"But now you must be holy in everything you do, just as God who chose you is holy. For the Scripture says, 'You must be holy because I am holy.'" 1 Peter 1 15-16

I must lay this foundation before I get to this subject matter.

Many times, when I'm out witnessing on the streets, some tell me that they don't consider the Old Testament, (Old Covenant), as being relevant for today because we are not under the law, but grace. I show them Scripture references that Jesus didn't come to abolish the Old Covenant, but to fulfill it, as He explained in Matthew 5:17, and I quote, "Don't misunderstand why I have come. I did not come to abolish the law of Moses or the writings of the prophets. No. I came to accomplish their pur-

Allow me to share some oth-

er passages of Scripture that Jesus said to assure us the Bible would not be complete without the Old Testament. Perhaps you've heard that Jesus is concealed in the Old Testament and revealed in the New Testament.

Please read Luke, Chapter 24 so that you'll be able to understand this better. After Jesus had risen from the dead. he suddenly joined two sad men walking to the village of Emmaus and asked them why they are so sad. They couldn't believe that He hadn't heard about the crucifixion of Jesus. They began telling Him, and in Verses 25-27, Jesus said, You foolish people! You find it so hard to believe all that the prophets wrote in the Scriptures. Wasn't it clearly predicted that the Messiah would have to suffer all these things before entering his glory?" "Then Jesus took them through the writings of Moses and all the prophets explaining from all the Scriptures the things concerning himself."

Verse 44 says, "When I was with you before, I told you that everything written about me in the law of Moses and the prophets and in the Psalms must be

fulfilled.'

Jesus said in John 5:46-47, "If you really believed Moses, you would believe me, because he wrote about me. But since you don't believe what he wrote, how will you believe what I said?"

If you are a born-again, water baptized believer in the Lord Jesus Christ, you are a spiritual child of Abraham. See Galatians 3:7-9, 26-29. If you don't know anything about the Old Testament, you'd have no idea who Moses and Abraham were.

When God chose Israel to be His special Covenant People in the Old Testament, He constantly told them through the prophets that they must be holy because He is Holy.

Exodus 22:31, "And you shall be holy men to Me: you shall not eat meat torn by beasts in the field; you shall throw it to the dogs."

Leviticus 11:44-45, For I am the LORD your God. You shall therefore consecrate yourselves, and you shall be holy; for I am holy. Neither shall you defile yourselves with any creeping thing that creeps on the earth. For I am the LORD who brings you up out of the land of Egypt, to be your God. You shall therefore be holy, for I am holy."

Precious people, we must know that it doesn't matter what we think; the only thing that matters is what He has already said in His Word. At the end of the day, we all will be judged by what is written in His Word and not about what we think. Revelation 20: 11-15.

My oldest sister was telling me on yesterday that when certain dignitaries visit other countries, often they are shown their magnificent temples of worship and their gods. We talked about how Christians are the Temples of the Living God. That's why He commands us to be holy because He's the God who lives in us.

1 Corinthians 6:15-20, "Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? Shall I then take the members of Christ and make them members of a harlot? Certainly not! Or do you not know that he who is joined to a harlot is one body with her? For the two He says, 'shall become one flesh.' But he who is joined to the Lord is one spirit with Him.

"Flee sexual immorality. Every sin that a man does is outside the body, but he who commits sexual immorality sins against his own body. Or do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and you are not your own? For you were bought at a price; therefore, glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's."

This is the conclusion of this series. All Scripture is taken from the New Living Translation Version of the Bible unless otherwise stated. You may not believe me...just what if I'm right!


lighting creates an uncomfortable work environment, so supplement with the softer light of a lamp.

I supported the paper regularly-buying 5 copies each month. I'd keep one for myself and took four to Hood Street Church of Christ to distribute there. I made sure to purchase from five different vendors each time, paying \$2 per copy. It wasn't charity-it was respect.

Through that experience, my friends and I met many intelligent, insightful people who happened to be home-

less. It challenged every ste-

reotype that many of us had been taught to believe about the homeless.

My husband, Leon, and I once helped a homeless man named Tommy. He was a kind man, a Black man who had spent time in prison but wasn't using drugs or alcohol. He just needed a break. Leon took him around town to help him get his Social Security card, a state ID, and a copy of his birth certificate.


Sadly, someone stole all of his belongings shortly after. We stepped in again to help him recover, and eventually, Tommy made it back home to Arkansas. His family welcomed him with a place to live and a job.

I later checked with others in the homeless community, and they confirmed-he really did go home.

There are so many people like Tommy, like that editor, like the men and women selling newspapers on street corners. They're not just stories of loss-they're stories of hope, resilience, and second chances.















