session, narrated by Delisa Burrell-Smith, a CRRC and

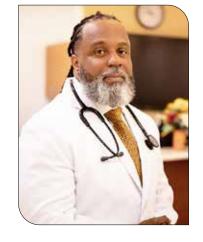

We want to invite the community to come out to celebrate 30 years of the ministry Operation Christmas Child in the LIFE CENTER of Highland Baptist Church located at 1900 N. 30th St. in Waco on Sunday, July 16 from 3-5 p.m.

This Special OCCasion will include hearing first-hand from shoebox recipient Edouard Ndecky who received a gift-filled shoebox at the age of 14 in West Africa. Ndecky will share how the tangible contents of the gift-box and the nontangible items such as the love expressed through the gift changed his life.

The Special OCCasion will also include a special packing party where guests will have the opportunity to help fill shoeboxes like the one Ndecky received as a young boy. The event is free and open to the public.

The Heart of Texas Area in Central Texas was one of the first areas to participate in the ministry of Operation Christmas Child. The ministry of Operation Christmas Child is a ministry of Samaritan's Purse which is headquartered in Boone, North Carolina. Operation Christmas Child began in 1993 when shoebox gifts were first delivered to children in wartorn Bosnia. The ministry is one of the largest children's evangelism ministries in the world.

The first collection of Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes from the Heart of Texas Area in 1997 totaled 300 shoebox gifts. Over the past 30 years, the

Heart of Texas Area which encompasses McLennan, Bosque, Hill, Hamilton, Limestone and the northern portion of Coryell Counties, have collected a total of more than 350,000 gift-filled shoeboxes.

"It is amazing to know that from right here in the Heart of Texas Area we have such generous people who faithfully pack gift-filled shoeboxes year after year to be sent to children all around the world," said Debbie Quarles, area coordinator of the Heart of Texas Team. "What began as a collection of 300 boxes a year from our area has grown to more than 21,000 giftboxes a year. The fact that we have reached a total of more than 350,000 children with the gospel over the last 30 years is beyond amazing. The number of children we have reached compares to filling McLane Stadium almost 8 times with children around the world. That is a lot of children. Our area goal is to reach 400,000

### MCLENNAN COMMUNITY INVESTMENT **FUND RECEIVES CDFI CERTIFICATION**

Waco, TX- 20 June 2023-The McLennan Community Investment Fund (McCIF) recently received its Community Development Financial Institution certification from the U.S. Department of Treasury. The certification is a feather in the cap of the McLennan Community Investment Fund, as only 55 organizations in Texas hold a CDFI certification.

Jane Allen, executive director of the McLennan Community Investment Fund, said certification as an official CDFI Fund would give McCIF access to significant federal grant funds from the U.S. Treasury. In turn, McCIF will lend those funds to small business owners in the area for their businesses' growth and further development. Some funds will also go toward providing financial education to small business own-

and new business knowledge is a powerful combination for small business growth," Allen

McLennan Community Investment Fund serves small business owners lacking access to traditional banking systems by offering access to capital and financial howassistance. Additionally, McCIF acts as an avenue for small business owners to gain the financial strength and necessary skills to successfully enjoy and benefit from traditional banking systems in the long run. Some exam-

ples of assistance from McCIF include skill and knowledge building, loans, and other financial aid forms.

Community Development Financial Institution (CDFI) Certification is a designation awarded to specialized organizations that provide financial services in low-income communities and to people who lack access to financing. By building the capacity of a nationwide network of CDFIs, the CDFI Fund works to empower lowincome and underserved people and communities to enter the financial

mainstream.

Being CDFI certified makes the McLennan Community Investment Fund eligible to apply for awards through various programs offered by the CDFI Fund. These awards help CD-Fls finance a wide range of activities, such as mortgage lending for first-time homebuyers, flexible underwriting for community facilities, and commercial loans for businesses in low-income areas. Each CDFI contributes to cultivating a healthy and stable local economy through varying strategies.

Zeta Phi Beta Sorority member, Dr. Lee shared fond memories of growing up amid racism in Marshall. Texas in a household that was loving, stabilizing, and sustaining to her through very critical times. Despite all that she endured during her lifetime, her dream remains for all Americans to experience Equality and Freedom, two key components that are needed for Justice to reign. Making a pledge to walk and gather signatures in a 1, 400-mile walk, 2.5 mile increments at a time, from Fort Worth to other cities in North Texas, Dr. Lee reminisced about her journey and the strides made in her pursuit to gain national recognition for Juneteenth, a celebration of freedom for slaves in Texas, who received the news of emancipation in 1865, two and a half years after the Emancipation Proclamation

was signed in 1863 by President Abraham Lincoln.

Many miles and tremendous challenges resulted in Dr. Opal Lee going to the White House, meeting President Joe Biden, witnessing him sign Senate Bill 475, being named the "Grandmother of Juneteenth", and carrying the banner for her work to establish Juneteenth as the eleventh federal holiday and the latest recognized federal holiday since Martin Luther King Day, observed every year on the first Monday in January, was named as a federal holiday in 1983. For her incredible efforts to make the world a better place, Dr. Lee has also been awarded three honorary doctorates, was named the 2021 Texan of the Year by the Dallas Morning News Editorial Board, the 2021 Unsung Hero of the Pandemic, Fort Worth's 2022 Person of

the Year, and a nominee for the Nobel Peace Prize along with numerous other honors. Added to her honors, the City of Waco proclaimed June 23, 2023, as Opal Lee Day with a proclamation from Mayor Dillion Meek and the Waco City Council.

The energy Dr. Lee displays is inspiring, and her humble but compelling plea is for young people, those under the age of 96, to take the reins and intensify the fight for Justice. She continues to pave the way through her plans to open a seventy-million-dollar Juneteenth Museum in Fort Worth for which forty million dollars has already been raised. To untiringly share her voice and support, Dr. Lee is an inspirational author and speaker who proudly proclaims, "Juneteenth is not a Texas thing. It's an American

One of the most loved benefits among Medicare recipients is the Over The Counter Benefit. It is also known as the OTC benefit.

In McLennan county, UnitedHealthcare, Humana and Baylor Scott and White offers this benefit through many of their plans; not all plans of their plans but many of their plans.

Please refer to your Summary of Benefis or Enrollment Guide to determine if your plan offers the OTC benefit.

Each quarter, you are allowed to get over the counter items at no charge. Shipping is also at no charge. The plan determines the amount received. If you are not on Medicaid, it varies from \$30 -\$50 per quarter.

If you are on Medicare with Medicaid you could get \$150 each month that you can use for groceries, OTC items and utility bills. This is the benefit that you hear about on ads. No matter what the ad says,

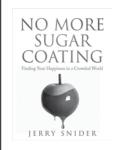

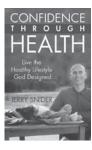

### **GETTING OUT OF DEBT**

(NewsUSA) - Sponsored Content - Debt can be a crushing burden in the best of times. And right now, with more uncertainty in the world than we have ever experienced, it can be more terrifying than normal.

Perhaps you've lost your job, you've gotten sick, or you had to stay home to take care of your kids and now you are in debt (or more in debt than you were before.) What do you do now? Many people are dealing with the same issues, but you can take steps to fix it.

First, write down your budget. Having a clear idea of what money is coming in and what money is going out is a huge step in getting out of debt. Be thorough. It is easy to overlook small expenses that add up over time or underestimate what you are spending on groceries or entertainment activities.

Second, look at your spending and think about expenses you can reduce. If you are spending more than you're making, you may need to cut costs to make your rent or mortgage payment. Look at such things as coffee shops when considering your

wants versus needs. That said, it's also paramount to build small "treats" into your budget so you're not constantly feeling as if you're depriving yourself.

Third, give priority to your secured debt. Secured debt is something such as a mortgage or car loan where there is property used as collateral. After secured debt comes interest-bearing unsecured debt such as a store credit card and finally, debt without interest, such as medical bills. All of your debt is important to pay, but prioritizing will help you come up with a plan, such as the debt snowball method.

The debt snowball method is a popular method of paying down debt. If, for in-

stance, you have three credit cards with payments of \$50, \$100, and \$150, stop using the cards altogether so you aren't building up the balances. Keep making the same payments even as the minimum goes down. If the \$50 payment card is paid off first, take that \$50 and add it to the payment for the account with the highest interest rate to get it paid off faster. Instead of paying \$100, you are now paying \$150. Once that account is paid off, apply that \$150 extra towards the final card payment and you will be out of debt far sooner than you would be normally.

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# MIDWAY TEACHER SAVES STUDENT FROM CHOKING

Just when a Midway ISD parent thought her admiration for her daughter's teacher couldn't grow any stronger, the teacher's heroic actions helped save her daughter from choking.

Jennifer Davis, a second grade teacher at Chapel Park Elementary School, was lining her class up to go outside for a picnic lunch on the last week of the school year when one of her students, Brianna Martinez, started choking on a grape.

"Brianna came up to me with wide eyes and her hands shaking," Davis said. "I quickly realized she was choking!"

Without hesitation, Mrs. Davis sprang into action.

"I dropped my water bottle and went around behind her so I could do the Heimlich, which I've never had to do before," Davis said. "I was calling out for help while doing the maneuver as there were some other teachers at a nearby table who I knew could help if it wasn't working."

By the time the other teachers realized what was happening and jumped up to assist, the grape was out.

"It all happened so fast, but at the same time seemed in slow motion," Davis said. "I hugged Brianna and reassured her that she was okay and did just what she needed to do to get the help she needed."

"Thanks to Jennifer, Brianna walked away with just feeling dizzy and a little scratchy throat," Brianna's mom Jessica Martinez said, "and thanks to her remaining calm, my daughter remained calm."

"It was hard not to break down in tears right then about the situation and the 'what-ifs' because I had 18 kids staring at me wondering what just happened," Davis said. "I led them outside for our picnic lunch and we had a talk about what to do if that happened to them and ways to possibly prevent it from happening."

In recognition of her exceptional calmness and quick actions, the Midway ISD Board of Trustees presented Mrs. Davis with the Midway Extra Mile Hero Award during the

school board meeting last Tuesday, and Brianna and her mom made sure they were there to help honor their hero.

"I am forever grateful for her," Martinez said. "I don't want to think about what could have happened if Jennifer had not been there."

"Even now, it's hard not to think of the 'what-ifs,'" Davis said, "but it's like I told her mom later that day when we talked about it. Don't dwell on the 'what-ifs,' but on the 'what did.' Brianna is okay and that's all that matters!"



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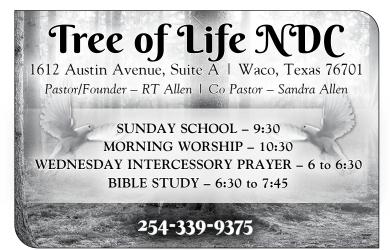
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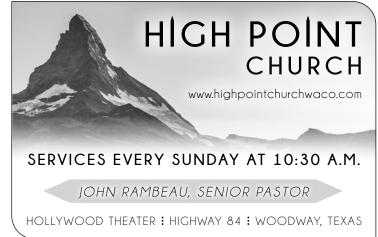


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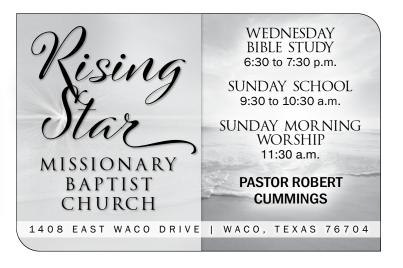

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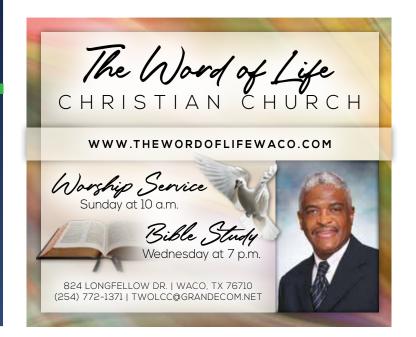
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#### **DYNAMICS OF CHANGE**

It has been said that change is the only thing that is permanent. Yet many rebel at change. The following dynamics may help give you a handle on the inevitable changes of life

When change is seen as threatening, it causes distress. When change is embraced as positive and welcomed, it can still be stressful yet produces a good stress that pumps you up and keeps you going. Wal-Mart moved him from stocker to greeter, and he was stressed in a negative way. I encouraged him to "give himself permission to be friendly." Once he saw a positive slant and gave himself permission to become something that had not come naturally in the past, he blossomed in the new position.

Visualize change in small increments. See the new position as something into which you can grow. My father was a builder. As a child I sat at the table with him drawing plans, and at age nine, designed my "dream home". It was fashioned after Tara of Gone with the Wind - large columnar porch, winding staircase, and more rooms than anyone would know what to do with. When I married, we moved into a small apartment, it was difficult to see us as changing into the type of people who would live in a Tara mansion. When we moved to an 1800 square foot home, the possibility became a little clearer.

When we nearly doubled the size of our house through expansion, the ability to change into a "plantation owner" has become even clearer. We are not there yet, but thorough embracing life changes and

goal setting, it will become a reality.

Look at where you were, to more accurately measure where you are. Because I was good at my job, I was advanced to an executive position, but I felt like a fish out of water. First, I gave myself permission to change. Second, I saw myself changing from staff to executive. Third, I looked at what kind of job I had done in the past that allowed the board to see possibilities in me that I did not see. I knew a young lady who had been in a power position for two years and was still overwhelmed. I encouraged her to look at how much she had grown, how much she had learned, how much she had changed, how many good decisions she had made. When

you recognize past change, future change becomes easier.

It's true on a basic level, if all you are worried about is outside appearances. That's because when you look at weight loss as a formula on paper, it doesn't matter where the calories come from. If you burn more than you consume you will lose weight.

The kicker is that although being overweight or obese is an indication of poor health, being at an appropriate weight does not mean someone is healthy. That's because health is determined by what's going on inside the body, no matter what the outside looks like. Not to mention that the longer we eat poorly, the harder the exercise becomes because the body isn't getting the nutrients it needs.

need to have a wide variety of foods. A point of clarifica-

tion, variety doesn't mean the same foods cooked in different ways. It means stepping outside your comfort zone and including fruits, vegetables, nuts, seeds, and whole grains that you don't typically eat.

Build your meals each week to include 40 different plant foods to go along with the variety of meat sources you like. It's quite a bit easier to do than it sounds but it does take a little planning. It also means not eating fast food very much because those menus rarely have more than 10 different plant foods.

The really cool thing about proper nutrition is your body will respond both internally and externally. You still need to exercise, but it's a lot easier to achieve and maintain

a healthy weight when feeding our cells correctly. You can then change your mindset around exercise, going from "I have to exercise today to lose weight" to "how do I want to move my body today for enjoyment."

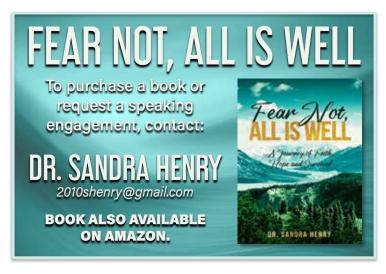

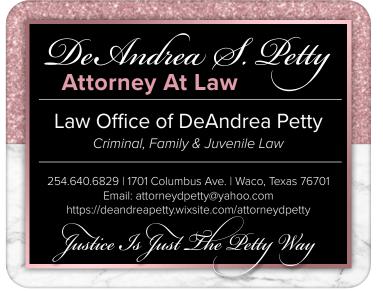

It was pitch-black dark outside, as I had no time to flip on the outside lights. I just needed to get out. Once inside my car, I let out a sigh, unaware that I had been holding my breath. Quickly locking the car doors, I knew I was on my way. The car was run down and bent up, but it was my path to freedom tonight and my only means of transportation. I'll never forget it. It was a gray and black Toyota, well....a fading gray and a fading black, a hatchback, about 8 years old at the time, and a stick. Ha! A stick. "Stop the car, Lynn, and give me the money!" he yelled, as he swiftly crawled into the back seat. He lurched through the bucket seats so fast that my head literally seemed to spin, like the girl in the Exorcist. Grabbing the steering wheel, he yelled again, "Gimme the money, Lynn!" The Exorcist...I was sure that his voice changed. But tonight...no, not tonight. I kept driving, the car swerving across into the other the lane and back again as he, too, gripped the wheel. You name it; I just about dealt with it. Many times over the years, I walked into my house to find that every piece of furniture and every appliance was gonesold in exchange for drugs. I remember waking up one Christmas Day to find that my babies' gifts were gone, sold for drugs. Once, I frantically searched the streets of Tampa because my husband put our 6-year-old out of the car since it was "too dangerous to take him to the crack house," he said. This was before the days of cell phones. I don't even remember how I found my baby boy. I could go on and on, but the only thing that matters is that one day, I accepted the truth that I had to forgive if I expected to move on with my life. I have since come to grips with the truth, that my now ex-husband was a good person, who loved people. When he was straight, he would give away his last. When he was not, he would take another person's last. I literally saw him take his shirt off and give it away. Once he pulled off his watch and gave it away, and then took my watch and gave it away, too. He had a heart of gold, but in addiction, he was the devil. Still, I had to find a way to forgive. I owed it to myself, my children, and my God.

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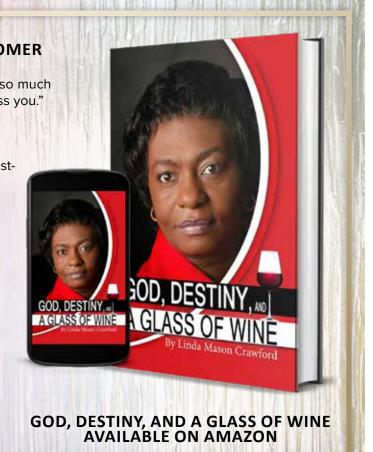
